Data Definitions

Total Job Seekers Served

Monthly Counts - Unduplicated head count of all job seekers who have received a staff assisted service, during the reporting month. A job seeker must receive a service within the month, to be counted within the month. (Unlike the current WP theory (Common Measures), which counts a job seeker, as long as they have not had a 90 day break in service).

Program to Date (PTD) Counts - Unduplicated head count of all job seekers who have received a staff assisted service during the reporting period. A job seeker may be counted more than once, within a PTD count, if they have had a 90 day break in service within the reporting period.

See the “Staff Assisted Services” column in Appendix A for a list of services that will qualify someone to be counted as a “job seeker served.”

Total New Job Seekers Served

Monthly Counts - Unduplicated head count of all **new** job seekers who have received a staff assisted service during the reporting month. Includes seekers who have not been served before and job seekers who have not received a service for at least 90 days.

Program to Date Counts - Unduplicated head count of all new job seekers who have received a staff assisted service during the reporting period. Includes job seekers who have not been served before and job seekers who have not received a service for at least 90 days. A job seeker may be counted more than once, within the PDT, if they have had a 90 day break in service within the reporting period.

See the “Staff Assisted Services” column in Appendix A for a list of services that will qualify someone to be counted as a “new job seeker served.”

Total Veterans/Transitioning Service Members Served

Unduplicated head count of job seekers who were identified, in SKIES, as a veteran or a transitioning service member at the time they received their staff assisted service, which put them in the Job Seekers Served or New Job Seekers Served counts.

See the “Staff Assisted Services” column in Appendix A for a list of services that will qualify someone to be counted as a “veteran/transitioning service member served.”

Total Staff Assisted Services Provided

A count of all staff assisted services provided. Job seekers may receive multiple services within the reporting month or program to date.

See Staff Assisted Service Matrix for a list of qualifying services, which will be counted.
